Dear Friends,

As we resume our Sundays in 'Ordinary time' we are offered an image of hope in the midst of turmoil. The question about who Jesus really is comes to the fore in this brief story. He calms a storm which had come out of nowhere as the disciples took him across the Sea of Galilee in a boat. Not only did he reprimand the waves, he also reprimanded the disciples for their lack of faith, and that is the whole point of the story: nothing could harm the disciples while he was with them because he exercised divine control over the forces of nature. They saw in Him one who could exercise power and perform miracles.

For the Jewish and Christian people of those times, God was trusted as the Lord of everything created; "nothing was outside the range of his power." In this instance, Mark was saying this about Jesus, even the words the disciples use to waken Jesus are usually addressed to God. Jesus stills the storm as if exorcising a demon in much the same way as he did in many of Mark's miracle stories.

Many people have found great comfort in sensing Jesus' constant presence in the most difficult and dangerous crises. He is at once a miracle worker and he has dominion over both natural and demonic forces. Through our faith in Him we too are better able to deal with the storm that can sometimes arise in our own life. It is the 'wind' of God's Spirit moving in and around us that enables us to blow away any bad winds or spirits that may find their way into our personal life's journey. The voice of Jesus we hear in this day's Gospel assures us of His presence in our lives
